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interior design as a relatively young discipline within the academic world of design has historically been interpreted as an extension of other fine arts narratives exist but they all too often treat interior design as a function of architecture or display rather than experience an independent interior design theory is virtually nonexistent professor lois weinthal envisions a future where interior design is treated with parity to architecture and industrial design a future with a new interior a reader for architects and interior designers weinthal has carefully curated a collection of forty eight essays that will form the foundation of interior design theory and shape future interior space her introductory essays illuminate each source prefacing and directing discussion of the material as it relates to interior design theory alluding to le corbusier's classic text she has organized this material into a framework that inspires conversation marking a break with the past and forming a new vocabulary for the discourse contributions to the book's eight sections include essays by david batchelor aaron betsky petra blaisse andrew blauvelt beatriz colomina le corbusier robin evans adolf loos ellen lupton charlotte perkins gilman michel serres henry urbach wim wenders and mark wigley

the handbook of interior architecture and design offers a compelling collection of original essays that seek to examine the shifting role of interior architecture and interior design and their importance and meaning within the contemporary world interior architecture and interior design are disciplines that span a complexity of ideas ranging from human behaviour and anthropology to history and the technology of the future approaches to designing the

interior are in a constant state of flux reflecting and adapting to the changing systems of history culture and politics it is this process that allows interior design to be used as evidence for identifying patterns of consumption gender identity and social issues the handbook of interior architecture and design provides a pioneering overview of the ideas and arrangements within the two disciplines that make them such important platforms from which to study the way humans interact with the space around them covering a wide range of thought and research the book enables the reader to investigate fully the changing face of interior architecture and interior design while offering questions about their future trajectory

aftertaste expanded practices in interior design is an edited volume comprising texts interviews and portfolios that collectively document new theories and emerging critical practices in the field of interior design the material is informed by but not limited to the annual aftertaste symposia hosted by parsons the new school of design the book's central argument is that the field of interior design is inadequately served by its historical reliance on taste making and taste makers and more recently from a set of theoretical concerns derived from architecture the volume seeks to set an expanded frame by advancing new voices and perspectives in both the theory and practice of interior design considered as an independent discipline in 2007 the department of architecture interior design and lighting at parsons the new school for design inaugurated an annual international symposium series dedicated to the critical study of the interior titled aftertaste these yearly symposia offer expansive views of interior studies highlight emerging areas of research identify allied practices make public its under explored territory and attract future designers and scholars to the field now in its fourth year aftertaste has proven to be one of the very few venues internationally for critically exploring interior design the field of interior design is asymmetrically served by the current literature in the field too frequently the current writing and making in interiors emphasize the ineffable the biographical and the social elite and promote a curiously unsubstantiated notion of connoisseurship as the principal basis for design other attempts to construct an intellectual agenda for the study of the interior draw heavily from architectural theory ignoring the discipline's own specific and autonomous history aftertaste the book is intended to adjust this imbalance by introducing interior design material that is theoretically and historically situated technically grounded demographically inclusive and aesthetically adventurous

interior design on edge explores ways that interiors both constitute and upset our edges whether physical conceptual or psychological imagined implied necessary or discriminatory the essays in this volume explore these questions in history theory and praxis through a focus on different periods cultures and places interior design on edge showcases new scholarship that expands and contests traditional relationships between architecture interiors and the people that use and design them provoking readers to consider the interior differently moving beyond its traditional architectural definition focusing on the concept of interiority considered in a wider sense it draws on interdisciplinary modes of investigation and analysis and reflects the latest theoretical developments in the fields of interior design history and practice with new research from both established and emerging authors this volume will make a valuable contribution to the fields of interior design architecture art and design history cultural history visual culture studies and urban studies

theorising interior architecture and design identity practices education and beyond looks at interior architecture and design from a contemporary and international perspective this book

takes theory building to be one of the most important activities for a discipline it explores the interior discipline's theoretical dimension and its pedagogical professional and creative practices in different settings across the globe organised in four thematic sections and an epilogue 20 chapters discuss vital aspects of contemporary interior architecture and design how has the interior discipline which for decades has been classified as emerging or relatively young over the past decades come of age academically in practice and in theory why is the identity of interiors a complex issue and how does this relate to theoretical concepts like surface interior exterior or time how can we think about the different roles of creative and professional practice or about interior education and the way it reflects and shapes interior identities and what lies beyond supposed disciplinary boundaries theorising interior architecture and design brings together 28 leading established and emerging interior educators researchers theorists and professionals who connect 17 countries on four continents detailed studies of culturally specific interior histories regional educational perspectives and national professional frameworks are complemented by authoritative theoretical discussions this book's scrutinising discourse provides a compelling theorisation of interiors as a multi lingual culturally situated discipline it is an essential reading for everyone concerned with interiors practising studying or working in educational and professional institutions

interior provocations history theory and practice of autonomous interiors addresses the broad cultural historical and theoretical implications of interiors beyond their conventionally defined architectural boundaries with provocative contributions from leading and emerging historians theorists and design practitioners the book is rooted in new scholarship that expands traditional relationships between architecture and interiors and that reflects the latest theoretical developments in the fields of interior design history and practice this collection contains diverse case studies from the late eighteenth century to the twenty first century including alexander pope's memorial garden design indaba and robin evans it is an essential read for researchers practitioners and students of interior design at all levels

this book traces and explores the evolution of taste from a design perspective what it is how it works and what it does karin tehve examines taste primarily through its recursive relationship to media this ongoing process changes the relationship between designers and the public and our understanding of the relationship of individuals to their social contexts through an analysis of taste design is understood to be an active constituent of social life not as autonomous from it this book reclaims a term long dismissed from interior design and unveils taste's role as a powerful social and political agent within systems of aesthetics affecting both its producers and consumers each chapter discusses a taste concept or definition analyzes its reciprocal relationship with media and explores its implications for interior design illustrated with 70 images taste's relationship to media is viewed through a variety of different lenses including books photography magazines internet social media and algorithms written primarily for students and scholars of interior design and related design fields this book will be a helpful resource for all those interested in the question of taste and is an invitation to produce and consume all media critically

extra ordinary interiors features research articles and visual essays by academics research students and practitioners that demonstrate contemporary modes of criticality and reflection on specific interior environments in ways that expand upon that which is ordinary of the everyday common banal or taken for granted

a collection of essays from prominent thinkers in the field of interiors topics touched upon in this collection ranges from cushions curtains and feminism the relationship between the interior and the enclave in the contemporary age of terror the regulation of the profession of interiors and the representation of the interior on the written page and in history with various debates on the identity the profession and the regulation of interior design essays on the relationship between theory and practice in interiors and case studies from and reflections upon the education of the interior designer this collection of writings is essential reading for anyone with an interest in interior design

digital fabrication in interior design body object enclosure draws together emerging topics of making that span primary forms of craftsmanship to digital fabrication in order to theoretically and practically analyze the innovative and interdisciplinary relationship between digital fabrication technology and interior design the history of making in interior design is aligned with traditional crafts but a parallel discourse with digital fabrication has yet to be made evident this book repositions the praxis of experimental prototyping and integrated technology to show how the use of digital fabrication is inherent to the interior scales of body objects and enclosure these three scales act as a central theme to frame contributions that reinforce the interdisciplinary nature of interior design and reinterpret traditional crafts by integrating new methods of making into conventional workflows featuring significant international practitioners and researchers the selected contributions represent the ever increasing interdisciplinary nature of design demonstrating a breadth of disciplines a foundational text for interiors students and practitioners digital fabrication in interior design expands the necessary dialogue about digital fabrication at the scale of interiors to inform design theory and practice

questioning the traditional boundaries between cities suburbs countryside and wilderness this issue of ad explores emergent types of public space in low density environments it describes this new form of urbanism decentralised in a constant process of expansion and contraction not homogenous or necessarily low rise nor guided by one mode of development

typology or pattern while functionally and programmatically dispersed settlements operate as a form of urbanism the place of collective spaces within them has yet to be defined and articulated the physical transformation of the built environment on the one hand and the change in our notion of the public on the other due to globalisation privatisation and segregation call for renewed interpretations of the nature and character of public space the concept of public space needs to be examined replaced re created or adapted to fit these conditions what is the place of the public in this form of urbanism and how can architecture address the notion of common collective spaces what is the current sociopolitical role of such spaces how does the form and use of these spaces reflect the conception of the public as a political or non political body and can architecture regain an active role in formulating the notion of the collective these and other issues are addressed through essays research projects and built work by distinguished writers such as bruce robbins albert pope and alex wall and practitioners including zvi hecker vito acconci mutopia manuel de sola morales martha rosler and manuel vicente in a search for new collective architectures within the dispersed city
